False Prophets	<a href="#">Numbers 16:2-3</a>	<a href="#">2:1</a>	<a href="#">1:4</a>	False prophets reject God's authority and lead many astray
Rebellion	<a href="#">Genesis 3:4-5</a>	<a href="#">2:4</a>	<a href="#">1:6</a>	Rejection of God's authority by the devil led to further rebellion
Destruction	<a href="#">Zephaniah 3:8</a>	<a href="#">2:6</a>	<a href="#">1:7</a>	Sodom & Gomorrah - examples of future destruction (also, 2 Peter 3:7)
False Prophets	<a href="#">Ezekiel 13:9</a>	<a href="#">2:10</a>	<a href="#">1:8</a>	False prophets perform divination, blasphemy and immoral acts
False Prophets	<a href="#">Numbers 22:22-35</a>	<a href="#">2:11</a>	<a href="#">1:9</a>	False prophets slander God's messengers or messages
Sin Nature	<a href="#">Proverbs 16:4-5</a>	<a href="#">2:12</a>	<a href="#">1:10</a>	Sin nature results in destruction (also, 2 Peter 2:2-3)
Divination	<a href="#">Joshua 13:22</a>	<a href="#">2:15</a>	<a href="#">1:11</a>	Divination mentioned in Revelation 2:4 has continued 1000's of years
Deception	<a href="#">Jeremiah 7:8-10</a>	<a href="#">2:13</a>	<a href="#">1:12a</a>	Evil doers that pretend to be godly but also worship false gods
Eternal Judgment	<a href="#">Psalm 49:14</a>	<a href="#">2:17</a>	<a href="#">1:12b-13</a>	Judgment upon the wicked has been reserved since their fall
Judgment Day	<a href="#">Isaiah 13:9-13</a>	<a href="#">2:9</a>	<a href="#">1:15</a>	Judgment upon the wicked will be fulfilled at the second advent
Boasting	<a href="#">Psalm 49:13</a>	<a href="#">2:18</a>	<a href="#">1:16</a>	The wicked are lovers of self - they entice others to do the same
Rebellion	<a href="#">Daniel 12:9-10</a>	<a href="#">3:3</a>	<a href="#">1:18</a>	There will be an increase of sin with open rebellion during the last days
